Recognised with the Prince's Trust Pride of Britain Award from HRH King Charles, Francesca has transformed the lives of over 2,600 girls through football and mentorship. A global advocate for sports therapy and mental health, Francesca's collaborations with Adidas, Arsenal, and Sky Sports continue to break barriers for women in sports. Her legacy is immortalised by a statue in her honour, reflecting her dedication to uplifting young women worldwide.

As the youngest member of MOPAC's London Policing Board, Sayce drives systemic reforms for safer communities. Recognised as Most Inspirational Person of the Year (MBCC Awards, 2022) and one of HSBC UK's Top 25 Black Entrepreneurs to Watch (2024), Sayce's work continues to dismantle systemic inequities and foster inclusive growth.




Elaine Cunningham-Walker in






Founder: Keighley Douglas
